

TIST FARMERS REAP FROM WHAT WAS SOWN

TIST farmers from Kabale have received the carb on money which was paid last week. The 123 groups received a total of 57 million shillings from the trees planted.

Every year, farmers wait for the payments according to the Green House Gas (GHG) agreement they signed. Farmers have been receiving money; it's now over 1 3 year. Farmers were excited after receiving the money. Batuma's son had this to say "My father is the one who introduced me to TIST, the day he sent TIST staff to count my tree. He passed away after 3 years, now I am taking over his responsibility.

I have received carbon money about six times this is the seventh payment. I promised to keep my trees according to the agreement I signed with the TIST programme. If I am not alive then my children will take over, I will have to warn them to follow my dream and the agreement signed. This is a programme meant for all generations.
